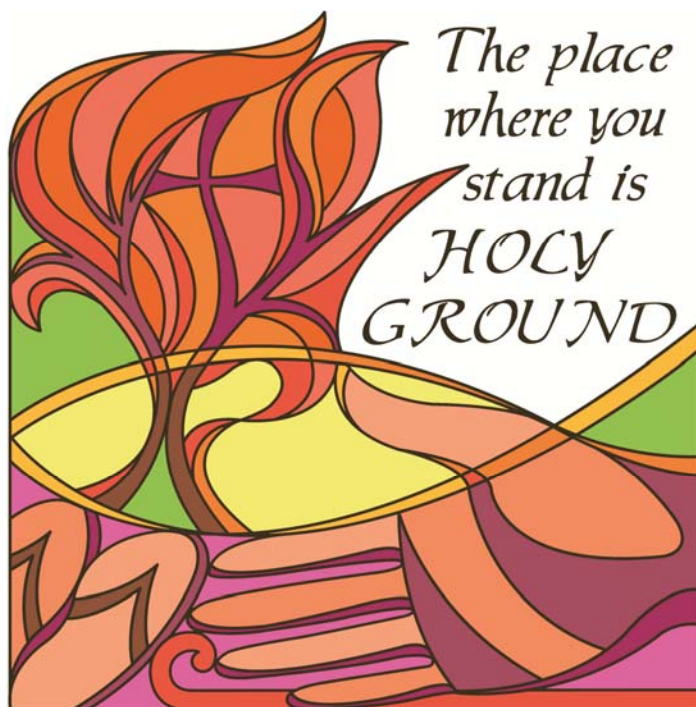

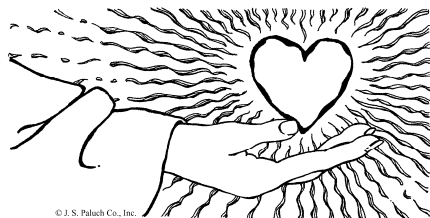
Third Sunday of Lent

Notes from the Pastor

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION - On this Third Sunday of Lent, Jesus relates in the gospel apparently to historical tragedies – one at the hand of Pilate and the other by an accident. His lesson is that these unfortunate people were not singled out because they were more grievous sinners than anybody else. No, we are all sinners who need to repent. The parable of the care-taker and the fig tree speaks of the mercy of God but that also we cannot presume on the mercy forever. We must get very serious about facing our sinfulness, repenting, receiving the Lord forgiveness and beginning once again to live life as the Lord Jesus wants us to by bearing the fruit of good words and deeds towards others.

COMMUNICATION FROM DR. RICHARD GOSSER

the Director of Partners in Progress, who presently in Haiti: "Friends, I read an article that mentions some 65,000 displaced persons from Turgeau. I drove past Turgeau this afternoon. It seemed to have more houses collapsed than standing. It's begun to rain here and shelter from the rain is still inadequate in most of the "sheet cities". People are focused on making it through the rainy season and can't begin to think about the hurricane season which will eventually follow. In spite of the struggles people are acting with grace and dignity. Street commerce is evident everywhere and people are putting together the broken pieces of their lives without so much as a roll of "duck tape" with which to do it. The courage and fortitude of people here is humbling. - Rich."

WHAT IS NEW ON THE OVERHAUL OF HEALTH CARE?

President Barack Obama's newly-unveiled health care

plan would lead to a massive expansion of abortion.
